<b>Program Strategy:</b> The overall and continuing strategy for the early learning component of the Jacksonville Journey program is to encourage families to engage in early learning experiences with their children who are 0-5 years of age.		
<b>Summary of Program:</b> ELC of Duval will provide scholarships to parents for at least 125 School Readiness (SR) children who already attend a Guiding Stars of Duval child care center. Guiding Stars of Duval (GSOD) is the voluntary quality rating improvement system that ELC of Duval uses to determine the level of quality offered at centers. Participating Journey child care centers must have a rating of 3, 4, or 5 stars and be in a 1.5 mile radius of the HUD anchor complexes identified by the Jacksonville Journey Oversight Committee. Participating child care centers will receive additional funding based on their current star level and meeting the required benchmarks to improve the quality of their program. Parents will be given an opportunity to attend the selected centers at no cost to them. The amount of the scholarship for the parent will be based on the age of the SR child.		
<b>Program Overall Status:</b> The following tasks have been completed for the month of June: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A request to extend the recruitment of SR families to June 30, 2016 to meet the deliverable was approved on June 22.</li> <li>• Additional lending library visits were made to all centers by the family engagement staff.</li> <li>• Center action plans were completed and discussed with all center directors by TA coaches. The action plans were created based on the results of the pre quality assessment and ERS checklists completed by the PS specialists.</li> </ul>
